**NOTICE OF THE THIRD APPORTIONMENT FOR
TITLE V, PART A—INNOVATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM STRATEGIES
OF THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001 (PL 107-110)
FISCAL YEAR 2004-05**

This apportionment, in the amount of \$6,151,790, is made from federal funds provided to the state under Title VI of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965 as amended by Title V of the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001 (PL 107-110). Upon receipt of this apportionment, participating local educational agencies (LEAs) will have received 100 percent of their total entitlement.

The purpose of these funds is to support innovative education programs. LEAs have the flexibility to design and implement innovative projects and activities within 1 or more of 27 innovative program areas identified in PL 107-110, Section 5131. Individual projects and activities should be designed to: (1) support local education reform efforts that are consistent with statewide education reform efforts; (2) implement promising educational reform and school improvement based on scientific research; (3) provide a continuing source of innovation, educational reform, and school improvement, including support of library services and instructional and media materials; (4) meet the educational needs of all students, including at-risk youth; and (5) improve school, student, and teacher performance, including professional development activities and class size reduction.

In accordance with federal law, entitlements are calculated on a point system formula using a rate of approximately \$2.09042 per point. LEAs receive one point per enrolled pupil as reported in the October 2003 California Basic Educational Data System, and one point for each pupil enrolled in participating private schools. In addition, LEAs are ranked on a statewide basis by their percentage of students eligible for free or reduced price meals (FRPM) as of October 2003. Based on this ranking, quartiles are established by dividing the total number of eligible LEAs into four equal groups. LEAs receive additional points per FRPM student as follows: 3.5 points for LEAs in the first quartile; 2 points for LEAs in the second quartile; 1 point for LEAs in the third quartile; and no points for LEAs in the fourth quartile.

Direct-funded charter schools must apply individually for this program. We identify the amount for direct-funded charter schools separate from the district or county amount. All

other charter schools must apply through their authorizing agency, and funding associated with the charter school is included in the district or county amount.

The United States Department of Education (ED) award number is S298A040005. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance subprogram number is 84.298A. This grant is subject to the provisions of Title V of the ESEA, as applicable, and the General Education Provisions Act (PL 103-382). This grant is also subject to the Title V regulations in Part 200 of Title 34 of the *Code of Federal Regulations (CFR)* and the *Education Department General Administrative Regulations*, 34 CFR Parts 76 and 77, 80-82, 85 and 97-99. The funding is appropriated in Schedule (2) of Item 6110-123-0890 of the Budget Act of 2004 (Chapter 208, Statutes of 2004). The California sub-allocation (pass-through) number is Program Cost Account (PCA) 14354.

Under the federal "Tydings Amendment," Section 421(b) of the General Education Provisions Act, 20 U.S.C. 1225(b), any funds that are not obligated at the end of the federal funding period (July 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005) shall remain available for obligation for an additional period of 12 months (to September 30, 2006).

In order to comply with federal cash management requirements, LEAs must expend federal funds in a timely manner. Although the Tydings Amendment provides specific timelines governing the expenditure/encumbrance of program funds, federal guidelines discourage the release of additional funding to LEAs that have not spent the dollars previously apportioned. LEAs are requested, therefore, to minimize the time frame between receipt and expenditure of federal program funds. The California Department of Education is reviewing the percentage of federal carry-over funds from prior fiscal years for each LEA. The release of future apportionments may be delayed for LEAs with significant balances.

Federal Title 34 CFR 80.21(i) also requires that any interest earned by LEAs on federal dollars be returned to the ED if the amount is in excess of \$100. LEAs should forward interest payments for remittance to the ED at:

Warrants will be mailed to each county treasurer approximately four weeks from the date of this Notice. For standardized account code structure coding, use Resource Code 4110, NCLB: Title V, Part A, Innovative Education Strategies, and Revenue Object Code 8290, All Other Federal Revenue. County superintendents of schools are requested to inform LEAs, including direct-funded charter schools, immediately of this apportionment.
