TEACHER: ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY

JOB SUMMARY

Under the direction of the Special Education Administrator, provides itinerant orientation and mobility services for visually impaired pupils; provides students with classroom adaptations and instruction to enable them to function socially and academically with their peers; collaborates with school staff, teachers, parents, students and community; performs other related duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

Required:

- 1. An appropriate valid California teaching credential authorizing instructional services to the visually impaired in the area of orientation and mobility.
- 2. A valid California driver's license.
- 3. A demonstrated ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing.

Desirable:

- 1. Experience teaching in the same discipline.
- 2. Established pattern of professional growth.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITY

- 1. Knowledge of modern teaching methods and techniques, especially within the domain of the credential.
- 2. Ability to manage and prioritize multiple activities.
- 3. Ability to communicate orally, in writing and/or sign language sufficient to express ideas, thoughts, lesson material and instructions clearly to students, community and staff.
- 4. Ability to collaborate effectively on inter- and intra-agency levels.
- 5. Ability to assess individual needs, establish realistic and appropriate goals and objectives, and design and implement a program for each student.
- 6. Ability to plan and conduct a system of continuous evaluation of each student's progress.
- 7. Ability to confer effectively with parents.
- 8. Ability to participate in scheduled staff meetings and IEP meetings.
- 9. Ability to develop and maintain a regular schedule for each student.
- 10. Ability to provide a suitable learning environment.
- 11. Knowledge of post-high school vocational opportunities.
- 12. Ability to keep accurate student records and submit reports in a timely manner.
- 13. Ability to direct and evaluate aides and volunteers.
- 14. Ability to drive a car.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS of this position are, but not limited to, the following:

- 1.Assess individual needs of each student.
- 2. Establish realistic and appropriate goals and objectives for each student.
- 3.Design and implement a program for each student.
- 4.Plan and conduct a system of continuous evaluation of each student's progress.
- 5. Confer with parents.

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- 6. Aid in design and implementation of an IEP for each student.
- 7. Maintain suitable learning environment, including appropriate planning and organization of material.
- 8. Provide appropriate materials for students.
- 9. Consult with appropriate support personnel.
- 10. Keep accurate class records.
- 11. Submit necessary reports in a timely manner.
- 12. Provide information on post-high school vocational opportunities.
- 13. Establish and evaluate a regular meeting schedule with each student.
- 14. Develop and implement reasonable personal goals and objectives.
- 15. Attend scheduled staff meetings and IEPs.
- 16. Facilitate regular classroom integration by establishing rapport with on-site personnel.
- 17. Share information with regular staff concerning the nature of the impairment of learning caused by the disability or vision loss.
- 18.Drive a car.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS for this position are, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. Facility to sit at a desk, conference table or in meeting rooms of various configurations for extended periods of time.
- 2. Facility and stamina to sit and stand alternately for up to 7 1/2 hours.
- 3. Facility to see and read lessons, books, rules and policies and other printed matter, with or without vision aids.
- 4. Facility to hear and understand speech at normal room levels, on the playground, and to hear and understand speech on the telephone.
- 5. Manual dexterity to dial a telephone, and operate audio-visual and other classroom equipment and teaching aids using both hands.
- 6. Facility to speak in audible tones so that others may understand clearly in normal conversations, on the playground, in training sessions and other meetings without a noticeable speech impairment.
- 7. Physical agility to lift 25 pounds to shoulder height, and 50 pounds to waist height; and to bend, to stoop, to walk on uneven terrain, to climb stairs, and to reach overhead.
- 8. Facility to drive a car.

NOTE: This list of essential functions and physical requirements is not exhaustive and may be supplemented as necessary in accordance with the requirements of the job.
