RE: ZEE Medical Medical First Aid Kit

To Whom It May Concern:

After reviewing the proposed contents of ZEE Medical's first aid kits, I find them to be more than adequate for use within the general workplace. The kits contain basic first aid treatments ranging from sterile bandages, antiseptics, burn treatments and cold packs, to sterile, one-time-use products for removal of eye contaminants.

Additionally, the first aid kits may contain non-prescription and non-drowsy tablets that are individually packaged in tamper resistant packets that include proper directions, warnings and expiration dates. There are tablets intended to relieve headaches, cold and allergy symptoms, sore throats, coughs, back aches, sinus congestion, and indigestion.

If there are special hazards in the workplace, such as toxic chemicals, processes involving high heat, corrosive and caustic substances, or high voltage electricity, then the supplies must be supplemented to meet those needs. The employer should examine the Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for all chemical materials present in the workplace to determine whether additional first aid supplies are necessary. If an SDS indicates that the eyes should be flushed in the event of exposure, then an eye wash station that meets ANSI Standard Z358.1 should be available in the work area.
